WHEREAS, the Legislature has received the sad news of the untimely death of the Honorable Richard L. Neuberger, United States Senator from Oregon; and

WHEREAS, Senator Neuberger was just completing his first term in the United States Senate and had recently filed for re-election; and

WHEREAS, Senator Neuberger had a distinguished record of achievement and service to his state and the Nation as a journalist, state legislator, and United States Senator; and

WHEREAS, Senator Neuberger has for many years been a staunch and active

supporter of Alaska's cause, particularly in the long and successful struggle for statehood; and

WHEREAS, the death of Senator Neuberger is a great loss to Alaska, his home state of Oregon and to the Nation;
