CHAPTER 111

AN ACT

Relating to the membership of the Alaska International Development Commission; amending Sec. 1, Ch. 61, SLA 1959; and providing for an effective date.

(H.B. 200)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. Sec. 1, Ch. 61, SLA 1959 is amended to read:

Section 1. **The Alaska International Development Commission.** There is hereby created as an agency within the office of the Governor the Alaska International Development Commission, the membership of which shall consist of the following persons:

- The Governor of the State of Alaska;
- The two United States Senators from Alaska;
- The United States Representative from Alaska in Congress;
- The Commissioner of Fish and Game for the state of Alaska;

The Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Alaska;

The Commissioner of Natural Resources for the State of Alaska;

One member of the Senate of the State of Alaska, to be appointed by the President of the Senate;

One member of the House of Representatives of the State of Alaska, to be appointed by the speaker of the House.

The term of office of each member of the Commission shall be concurrent with the term of office of his elected or appointed position and it shall not survive his resignation or removal from his elected or appointed position.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 112

AN ACT

Relating to the Fish and Game Code; amending Sec. 11, Art. III, Ch. 94, SLA 1959; and providing for an effective date.

(H.B. 266)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. Sec. 11, Art. III, Ch. 94, SLA 1959 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 11. **License Forfeiture.** Upon both first and second convictions of a person for a violation of any provision of this Article or of any Federal or State

law or regulation for the protection of the commercial fish of Alaska, the Court may, in addition to the penalty imposed by law, forfeit the commercial fishing license of such person for a period of one year. Upon a third conviction of any such person of any such violation, the forfeiture of such license for a period of not more than three years shall be mandatory. Any forfeiture under this
