

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. Sec. 13, Ch. 81, SLA 1960 is amended to read:

Sec. 13. **Applicability to Persons on Parole or Incarcerated.** The provisions of this Act shall apply to all persons convicted and sentenced in the superior court and the district magistrate courts

of this state, and to all persons convicted of a crime which was punishable under laws enacted by the Alaska Territorial Legislature and who were convicted and sentenced before Alaska became a state or before the Alaska state court system was in operation.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 39

AN ACT

Making certain appropriations and line item transfers for legislative expenses; and providing for an effective date

(H.B. 280)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. The following line item transfers are made among the appropriations made to the state legislature for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1961:

CHAPTER 40

AN ACT

Relating to the identification of authentic Native articles of handicraft made in Alaska; and providing for an effective date.

(S.C.S.H.B. 4)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. Any person who possesses an authentic Native article of handicraft made in Alaska may obtain, in the manner provided by this Act, an identification seal to identify the article as being the product of an authentic Alaska Native handicraft. The identification seal may be affixed only

to authentic Native articles of handicraft made in Alaska.

Sec. 2. The commissioner of commerce is responsible for the administration of this Act, including the design, method of affixing, preparation, issuance, and control of identification seals; the issuance of permits to agents to distribute the seals; the supervision of the use of the seals; and the
