SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 1

Relating to the death of Senator William E. Beltz.

Be It Resolved by the Senate in Second Legislature, First Session Assembled, the House concurring:

WHEREAS, since the adjournment of the First State Legislature the legislature and the state have incurred a great loss through the passing of Senator William E. Beltz; and

WHEREAS, Senator Beltz had served his district and all Alaska as a member of the territorial and state legislatures with notable distinction and ability; and

WHEREAS, his integrity and qualities of leadership prompted his election as President of the Senate for the historical sessions of the First State Legislature; and

WHEREAS, his record of service and endeavor will always stand as an inspiration to those who aspire to the finest standards of good citizenship and public service;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate in Second Legislature, First Session assembled, the House concurring, that this resolution serve as an expression of the esteem and high regard of the members of the Legislature for the late Senator William E. Beltz and as a means of extending to Mrs. William E. Beltz and her family the sincerest condolences and best wishes of the members of the Legislature on behalf of the people of the State of Alaska.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3

Relating to the creation and report of a Vocational Education Executive Committee.

Be It Resolved by the Senate in Second Legislature, First Session Assembled, the House Concurring:

WHEREAS, the Legislature and the people of the state have approved an expansion of vocational education facilities in the state; and

WHEREAS, the federal government and several private foundations have expressed an interest in the furtherance of vocational education; and

WHEREAS, the state has both the opportunity and responsibility to analyze the existing program and to explore the possibilities of securing grants-in-aid for the furtherance of the state's vocational education program;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate in

Second Legislature, First Session assembled, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Secretary of State serve as chairman of a Vocational Education Executive Committee composed of himself, a designee of the Commissioner of Education specializing in vocational education, a faculty designee of the President of the University of Alaska; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Vocational Education Executive Committee reassess the vocational education program in Alaska and submit a report on the need, desirability, feasibility, costs, benefits and availability of public and private grants for vocational education to the Legislative Council no later than August 1, 1961; the Legislative Council to report on its review and recommendations to the Legislature on or before the date set for the convening of the 1962 regular session.
