

Senate Resolutions

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 2

Relating to the Southeastern Basketball Tournament.

Be It Resolved by the Senate in Second Legislature, First Session Assembled:

WHEREAS, inter-community hospitality and cooperation play an important part in the development of awareness and appreciation of what each community has to offer; and

WHEREAS, the national guard armories of the state are intended for both armory

and community center purposes;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate in Second Legislature, First Session assembled that the Adjutant General of the Alaska National Guard and the members of the Juneau National Guard Armory Board take appropriate action to make the facilities of the Juneau National Guard Armory available to house the teams participating in the forthcoming Southeastern Basketball Tournament.

Passed by the Senate February 7, 1961.

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 3

Relating to the establishment of a post office at Russian Mission, Alaska.

Be It Resolved by the Senate in Second Legislature, First Session Assembled:

WHEREAS, the village of Russian Mission, located on the lower banks of the Yukon River, is without a post office; and

WHEREAS, the people of Russian Mission desire a post office; and

WHEREAS, the post office would serve the immediate area of Russian Mission and the growing trading area of the lower

Yukon;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate in Second Legislature, First Session assembled that the Honorable J. Edward Day, Postmaster General of the United States, is respectfully urged to establish a post office at the village of Russian Mission, Alaska; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be sent to the Postmaster General and the members of the Alaska delegation in Congress.

Passed by the Senate February 10, 1961.

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 4

Relating to the inventorying of state-owned furniture and equipment.

Be It Resolved by the Senate in Second Legislature, First Session Assembled:

WHEREAS, it is essential to the orderly functioning of all branches of the state government that the nature, amount and location of all state-owned furniture and equipment be known; and

WHEREAS, a complete inventory of all furniture and equipment owned by the

State of Alaska is not now available;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate in Second Legislature, First Session assembled that the Commissioner of Administration take appropriate action to see that an inventory reflecting the nature, amount and location of all state-owned furniture and equipment be accomplished during 1961 and that a report regarding its completion be submitted to the Second Legislature, Second Session.
