CHAPTER 104

AN ACT

**Appropriating to the Department of Public Works; and providing for an effective date.**

(S.B. 298)

**Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

Section 1. The sum of \$217,490 is appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Public Works for highway

administration expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1962.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 105

AN ACT

**Relating to the citizenship of state employees; amending Sec. 11-1-4, ACLA 1949, as last amended by Ch. 74, SLA 1959; and providing for an effective date.**

(H.B. 261)

**Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

Section 1. Sec. 11-1-4, ACLA 1949, as last amended by Ch. 74, SLA 1959, is amended to read:

**Sec. 11-1-4. Employment of Persons Not Citizens Prohibited.** It shall be unlawful for the State of Alaska or any municipality in the state to employ at any rate of compensation as officer, agent, or servant any person who is not a citizen of the United States, except that the provisions of this Act shall not apply to doctors, dentists, public health nurses, and technicians employed by the Alaska Department of Health, or to biologists or other technicians employed by the

Alaska Department of Fish and Game; provided, however, that such persons shall have filed their petition for naturalization and shall actively pursue such petition and shall have, before employment, taken and submitted to the oath provided for in Chapter 113, SLA 1949, known as the non-Communist oath; and provided further, that in no event shall this Act apply to teachers, librarians, or other professional persons employed on an emergency basis or temporarily employed or retained under a foreign exchange program.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 106

AN ACT

**Relating to the transfer of state construction equipment to political subdivisions; and providing for an effective date.**

(H.B. 406)

**Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

Section 1. The commissioners of the Department of Public Works and the Department of Highways are authorized to transfer directly to any political subdivision of the state, including any village organized under Federal Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984), as amended by the Act of May 1, 1936 (49 Stat. 1250), the title to any automotive and construction equipment which can be utilized in the maintenance or construction of roads and airports. No such equipment may be transferred unless it is in excess of known state requirements within the major senatorial district and is intended for use, to some extent, to maintain and construct airports or roads. The

commissioners may transfer equipment which in their judgment is not economically repairable or is obsolete, without regard to the excess provision herein. The commissioners shall determine how the equipment is to be allocated in the best interests of the state. The commissioners are authorized to promulgate necessary rules and regulations to implement this Act.

Sec. 2. Any political subdivision receiving title to any automotive and construction equipment is hereby prohibited from selling the same for a period of two years following the date title is transferred.

Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

## CHAPTER 107

### AN ACT

**Permitting the use of reels mounted on seine skiffs for hauling in or letting out purse seine leads; and providing for an effective date.**

(H.B. 430)

**Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

Section 1. Sec. 1, Ch. 26, SLA 1959, is amended to read:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation, or association to use, employ, or operate a drum or reel around which a purse seine is coiled, rolled, or looped for purposes of taking or removing fish from any body of water located on or over any lands or tidelands owned or hereafter acquired by the State

of Alaska, or over which the State of Alaska has or hereafter acquires jurisdiction. Nothing herein shall prevent the use of power blocks or the use of a reel mounted on a seine skiff to haul in or let out the separate purse seine lead which is temporarily connected to the purse seine proper, as these terms are generally employed or used in the fishing industry.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

## CHAPTER 108

### AN ACT

**Providing for deposits into the International Airport Revenue Fund; appropriating from the Fund; lapsing appropriations; and providing for an effective date.**

(C.S.H.B. 479)

**Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

Section 1. On and after April 1, 1962,

all revenues, fees, charges, and rentals derived by the state from the ownership, lease, use, and operation of the international airports owned and operated by the
