

CHAPTER 5

AN ACT

Appropriating the sum of \$302.05 out of the monies in the general fund not otherwise appropriated to reimburse employees of the Department of Military Affairs for actual personal losses in line of duty; and providing for an effective date.

(H.B. 264)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. The sum of \$302.05 is hereby appropriated out of monies in the general fund not otherwise appropriated to reimburse four full-time employees of the Department of Military Affairs for actual personal losses in line of duty as a result of an Alaska Air National Guard aircraft crash in November, 1957.

Sec. 2. The monies hereinabove appropriated shall be disbursed on properly

drawn vouchers for the following persons and in the following amounts:

To Captain Robert D. Ellis	\$ 65.00
To Captain Wallace J. Harrison	24.95
To First Lieutenant Harry S. Aase	157.85
To Warrant Officer Richard J. Mueller	54.25

Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 6

AN ACT

Relating to physicians acting under emergency circumstances; and providing for an effective date.

(S.C.S.H.B. 225)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. Any physician, licensed in this state or any other state, who voluntarily attempts to aid an injured person in this state who is in need of immediate medical care, and under emergency circumstances that suggest that the giving of

aid is the only alternative to death or serious bodily injury shall not be liable except for wilful wrongs committed in rendering the aid.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 7

AN ACT

Relating to financing state participation in the Century 21 Exposition; appropriating to the Department of Commerce and transferring from a certain line item appropriation; and providing for an effective date.

(H.C.S.S.B. 96)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. The sum of \$118,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the De-

partment of Commerce for participation by the State of Alaska in the Century 21 Exposition in Seattle.

Sec. 2. The sum of \$19,000 is transferred

from the line item appropriation for contractual services made to the Division of Tourism and Economic Development, Department of Commerce, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1962, to supplement the appropriation for Century 21 Exposition participation made by this Act.

Sec. 3. The appropriation made by Sec. 1 of this Act shall be reduced by the

amount of any cash contribution for state participation made from any source after a total of \$20,000 in cash contributions has been received, unless the contribution is earmarked for a specific project by the contributor.

Sec. 4. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 8

AN ACT

Changing the expiration date of motor vehicle registration; amending subsec. (12), Sec. 3, Ch. 124, SLA 1951; and providing for an effective date.

(H.B. 334)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. Subsec. (12), Sec. 3, Ch. 124, SLA 1951, is amended to read:

(12) **Expiration of Registration.** Every vehicle registration under this act and every registration card and every registration plate issued hereunder shall expire at midnight on the first day of March of each year. The owner of a

vehicle registered under this act shall be entitled to operate such vehicle under the registration of such vehicle for the preceding year upon displaying the registration plates issued for such year until the thirty-first day of May of the year for which the registration is required under the provisions of this act.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 9

AN ACT

Providing for the amount of funeral expenses that may be allowed under the Alaska Workmen's Compensation Act; amending subsec. (1), Sec. 8, Ch. 193, SLA 1959.

(C.S.H.B. 108)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. Subsec. (1), Sec. 8, Ch. 193, SLA 1959, is amended to read:

Sec. 8. **Compensation for Death.** If the injury causes death, the compensa-

tion shall be known as a death benefit and shall be payable in the amount and to or for the benefit of the persons following:

(1) Reasonable and necessary funeral expenses not exceeding \$1000.
