

## CHAPTER 84

## AN ACT

**Relating to amending, repealing, or citing the Alaska Statutes; and providing for an effective date.**

(S.B. 293)

**Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

Section 1. Pending their formal adoption as the law of the state, the Alaska Statutes as described and adopted as prima facie evidence of the law by Ch. 16, SLA 1962, may be cited, amended, or repealed.

Sec. 2. A section of the Alaska Statutes expressly amended by the legislature, including the entire context set out in the amendatory Act, shall, as amended, constitute the law.

Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on January 1, 1963.

## CHAPTER 85

## AN ACT

**Relating to the concealment of merchandise in mercantile establishments; and providing for an effective date.**

(S.B. 294)

**Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

Section 1. Whoever, without authority, wilfully conceals upon or about his person the goods or merchandise of any retail business establishment, not theretofore purchased by the person, while still upon the premises of the retail business establishment, with intent to deprive the owner of such goods or merchandise, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500 or by imprisonment for not more than six months, or by both. Goods

or merchandise found concealed upon or about the person and which have not theretofore been purchased by the person shall be prima facie evidence of a wilful concealment.

Sec. 2. Any person found guilty of a second or subsequent offense of wilful concealment of goods as defined in Section 1 of this Act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished in the discretion of the court.

Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

## CHAPTER 86

## AN ACT

**Relating to a curfew for minors; and providing for an effective date.**

(S.B. 255)

**Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

Section 1. The provisions of any curfew ordinance enacted by a city or village of any class concerning minors shall be im-

posed in the total area within 20 miles of the limits of that city or village. In the event a given area lies within 20 miles of two or more cities with conflicting curfew ordinances, the provisions of the curfew ordinance of the city having the largest

population shall prevail as to that overlapping area.

Sec. 2. The penalty for violation of this Act shall be as prescribed by the curfew ordinance of the city, and any fine so paid shall be paid to the city when the violation takes place therein, or shall otherwise be paid to the state; provided, however, that the penalty shall not exceed a fine of \$300, or imprisonment for 30 days, or both.

Sec. 3. The municipal peace officers shall enforce the provisions of the ordinance inside the city limits, and, under the

provisions of this Act, the state peace officers shall enforce the provisions of the ordinance in the area outside the city limits. In areas where state peace officers are not available, the municipal peace officers shall be authorized to enforce the provisions of the ordinance in the area outside the city limits when such enforcement responsibilities are delegated by contract between the state and the municipality.

Sec. 4. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

## CHAPTER 87

### AN ACT

**Relating to employment for certain tax exempt organizations in the Alaska Employment Security Act; and providing for an effective date.**

(C.S.H.B. 189)

**Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

Section 1. Sec. 222, Art. II, Ch. 5, ESLA 1955, is repealed and re-enacted to read:

Sec. 222. The term "employment" shall not include service performed by an individual in any calendar quarter after June 30, 1962, in the employ of any organization exempt from income tax under Section 501(a) of the Federal Internal Revenue Code (other than an organization described in Section 401(a)) or under Section 521 thereof, if (a) the remuneration for such service is less than \$250; or (b) such service is performed in the employ of a school, col-

lege, or university by a student who is enrolled and is regularly attending classes at the school, college, or university; or (c) such service is performed by a duly ordained, commissioned, or licensed minister of religion in the exercise of his ministry, or by a member of a religious order in the exercise of duties required by such order. The term "employment" shall not include service performed by shareholders in a professional corporation under the Professional Corporation Act of 1962, or service performed by employees of state-assisted agricultural fairs.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect July 1, 1962.

## CHAPTER 88

### AN ACT

**Appropriating to the Department of Health and Welfare; and providing for an effective date.**

(H.B. 305)

**Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

Section 1. The sum of \$45,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the De-

partment of Health and Welfare to reimburse hospitals and physicians on an approximate total cost basis for expenses incurred for indigent patients certified or
