

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 61

Relating to the enrollment of House Bill No. 120, as amended.

Be It Resolved by the House in Second Legislature, Second Session Assembled, the Senate Concurring:

WHEREAS House Bill No. 120, as amended, (Uniform Commercial Code) if formally enrolled would involve at least two weeks of typing and proofreading; and

WHEREAS it is the desire of the Legislature that unnecessary delay and expense be avoided in the final processing of this bill;

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives in Second Legislature, Second Session assembled, the Senate concurring, that Uniform Rules 59, 60, and 68 are suspended in their application to House Bill No. 120, as amended, and that the follow-

ing procedure is authorized in handling the bill:

(1) Six copies of the bill as introduced along with the amendments adopted by both houses will be certified as the tentative enrolled copies by the certifying officers of the House and Senate and transmitted to the Governor for his action.

(2) When the Governor has signed the tentatively enrolled copy, the enrolling clerk will prepare it in suitable form for the printer and upon return of the printer's copy it will be proofread against the tentatively enrolled copy. The certifying officers of each house will then certify the approved printer's copy as the official enrolled version of the Act and deposit it with the Secretary of State for permanent filing.
