

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 18

Relating to the creation of a favorable economic climate in and for Alaska.**Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives:**

WHEREAS the words, "favorable economic climate," as used herein are defined as follows:

1. Having fair and equitable treatment in general and administrative regulation for all segments of Alaska's economy;
2. Having that amount of state government which can be supported by the commerce of the state;
3. Equitable and realistic tax policies having equal application to all peoples of the state;
4. Equitable and realistic treatment in all matters concerning labor-management relations;
5. Fostering those realistic, practical, and technological conditions which will enable Alaska industries to compete for out-of-state markets; and

WHEREAS all commerce is normally the prime mover in stimulating the economy; and

WHEREAS prosperous, creative, and healthy commerce broadens the tax base, thereby providing revenues needed for

public facilities and services within the state; and

WHEREAS a favorable economic climate is the prime prerequisite to attracting capital and commerce to Alaska; and

WHEREAS an unfavorable economic climate discourages the investment of capital which is free to seek the most favorable locations and to accept the inducements offered elsewhere; and

WHEREAS the establishment of a favorable economic climate is in the public interest as the only means of securing an improvement in the standard of living for the people of this State;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislature of the State of Alaska in Third Legislature, First Session assembled, that the Governor, and the Commissioners of each State Department be requested to examine all discretionary actions and orders in any way affecting business, industry, and agriculture in terms of the effect of such governmental action upon the economic climate in the State of Alaska; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Clerk of the House is directed to transmit copies of this resolution to the Governor, and to each Commissioner of each State Department in the government of the State of Alaska.

Relating to Sheldon Jackson Junior College and High School.**Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives:**

WHEREAS Sheldon Jackson Junior College and High School has been producing well-trained citizens for Alaska since it was organized on April 17, 1878; and

WHEREAS the school will celebrate its 85th anniversary of service to the people of the state on April 17 of this year;

BE IT RESOLVED that the appreciation of the House of Representatives is extend-

ed to the staff and students of this historic institution on its 85th anniversary, and to the Board of National Missions of the United Presbyterian Church for the valuable educational service it has provided the state; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be sent to the Honorable R. Rolland Armstrong, D.D., President of the Sheldon Jackson Junior College and High School; and the Honorable Kenneth Neigh, D. D., General Secretary of the Board of National Missions of the United Presbyterian Church.
