Secs. 310 - 400 of this chapter do not apply to any benefit, refund, or interest payable under the Public Employees' Retirement System applicable to the decedent's service or to an amount the disposition of which is otherwise expressly prescribed by state law.

Sec. 39.20.380. Change or Revocation of Designation. The employee may change or revoke a designation made under this chapter at any time without notice to the beneficiary by written notice filed with the Department of Administration.

Sec. 39.20.390. Employees to Be In-

formed. Each department shall inform its employees of the provisions of this chapter.

Sec. 39.20.400. Definitions. In secs. 310 - 390 of this chapter

(1) "unpaid compensation" means the pay, salary, or allowances, or other compensation due on account of the services of the decedent for the state;

(2) "employee" means a person entitled to receive unpaid compensation from the state.

Sec. 2. This Act is expressly declared to be retroactive to March 26, 1964.

Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

CHAPTER 73

AN ACT

Relating to damages for extraction of oil or gas without right.

(S.B. 337)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 31 is amended by adding a new chapter to read:

Chapter 30.

Sec. 31.30.010. Damages for Wrongful Extraction of Oil or Gas. (a) If oil or gas has been or is extracted from any existing or subsequently drilled well by any person without right but who asserts a claim of right in good faith or who is acting under an honest

belief as to the law or the facts, the measure of damages, if there is any right of recovery under existing law, shall be the value of the oil or gas at the time of extraction, without interest, after deducting all costs of development, operation, and production. The costs shall include taxes and interest on all expenditures from the date of the expenditures.

(b) In this section "oil or gas" includes all hydrocarbon minerals.

CHAPTER 74

AN ACT

Permitting the State Bond Committee to borrow money in anticipation of the sale of general obligation bonds issued to meet natural disasters and other public emergencies; and providing for an effective date.

(S.B. 352)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 37.15.300 is amended to read:

Sec. 37.15.300. **Borrowing in Anticipation of Sale of Bonds Permitted.** When the State Bond Committee considers it in the best interests of the state, it may borrow money in anticipation of the sale of general obligation and revenue bonds, if

(1) the general obligation bonds to be sold have been authorized by law and ratified by a majority vote of the qualified voters of the state who vote on the question; or

(2) the general obligation bonds to be sold have been authorized by law for the purpose of meeting natural

disasters, repelling invasion, suppressing insurrection, or defending the state in war; or

(3) the revenue bonds to be sold have been authorized by law; and

(4) money to be derived from the sale of general obligation and revenue bonds have been appropriated by the legislature.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

Relating to guides; and providing for an effective date.

(C.S.H.B. 347)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

Section 1. AS 16.05.250 (6) is amended to read:

(6) establishing the qualifications for guides and assistant guides, certifying master guides, regulating guide activities, and maintaining a guide register;

Sec. 2. AS 16.05.340 (12) is amended to read:

(12) Assistant guide license --\$5

Sec. 3. AS 16.05.340 is amended by adding a new paragraph to read:

(17) Master guide license ----\$50

Sec. 4. AS 16.05.410 (d) is amended to read:

(d) A master guide, licensed guide, or assistant guide upon conviction of a violation of a provision of a federal or state sport fish, game, or guide law or regulation may have his master guide certificate, registered guide license, or assistant guide license revoked by the court for any period up to five years.

Sec. 5. AS 16.05.410 (e) is amended to read:

(e) This section shall not be construed to divest the Board of Fish and Game of the power to revoke, suspend, or refuse issuance of a master guide certificate or a guide or assistant guide license in the exercise of its powers of regulation.

Sec. 6. AS 16.05.420 (c) is repealed and re-enacted to read:

(c) A master guide, licensed guide, or assistant guide violates this chapter if he has knowledge of a violation of this chapter, a regulation adopted under this chapter, or of any other fish and game statute or regulation, and fails to report the violation promptly to the department.

(d) A master guide, licensed guide, or assistant guide who aids or abets the commission of a violation of this chapter or a rule and regulation promulgated under this chapter, or who suffers or permits the commission of a violation in his presence or view violates this chapter.
