

## Senate Concurrent Resolutions

### SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 6

**Relating to the late Charles D. Jones.**

**Be it Resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring:**

WHEREAS, since the last meeting of the Legislature, Charles D. Jones of Nome, a pioneer Alaskan and pioneer member of the Alaska Legislature, has been taken by death; and

WHEREAS the Honorable Charles D. Jones —

First came to Nome in 1900 to engage in mining and continued his interest in that field until his death;

Served as United States Marshal at Nome for a decade;

Served in the First Territorial Legislature in 1913;

Returned to the Legislature in 1953

to serve as President of the Senate and continued to serve as a member through the 22nd Territorial Legislature; and

Was a member of Igloo No. 1 of the Pioneers of Alaska and served as state president of that organization; and

WHEREAS the late Charles D. Jones truly epitomized those pioneer virtues of perseverance, industry, and public service which are so highly regarded by pioneer and new Alaskans;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature, for the people of Alaska, by this resolution speaks in praise of its former colleague and expresses to the family of the Honorable Charles D. Jones its deepest sentiment of sympathy for their loss and the loss to the State of Alaska.

### CS FOR SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 10

**Relating to the immediate construction of the Girdwood-Alyeska access road.**

**Be it Resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring:**

WHEREAS the Alyeska Ski Corporation has been attempting to get state action for the construction of 3.10 miles of access road from Girdwood to Alyeska since 1960; and

WHEREAS the need for and value of this access road has been acknowledged by federal and state officials and the road has been officially approved since 1962 as a secondard road of the Federal Aid Highway System; and

WHEREAS despite the delays, the

Alyeska Ski Corporation was able to bring the Olympic Ski Trials to Alaska in 1963; and

WHEREAS the corporation is now negotiating with the Olympic Committee for a major international pre-Olympic ski race in 1967 with a commitment that the completion of necessary facilities dependent on a proper access road will be available before that time;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Governor is requested to direct the Department of Highways to proceed with the construction and completion of the Girdwood-Alyeska access road in 1964.

### SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 20

**Relating to the authority of the Governor to meet the current emergency.**

**Be it Resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives Concurring:**

WHEREAS certain areas of the state have been devastated by an unprecedented disaster requiring extraordinary action; and

WHEREAS it is the will of the Legislature that the Governor be vested with all powers necessary to meet with the emergency without delay;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature

does hereby recognize the need for extraordinary powers to be vested in the Governor and employed at his discretion and the Governor is hereby authorized to make the necessary transfer of any and all appropriated funds to meet the current emergency.

### SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 22

**Relating to the recess and reconvening of the Second Regular Session of the Third Legislature.**

**Be it Resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring:**

That the Second Regular Session, Third Legislature, will stand at recess effective 12:00 o'clock noon, April 14, 1964, and reconvene at Juneau at 2:00 p.m., May 25, 1964, unless the President and the majority and minority leaders of the Senate and the Speaker and the majority and minority leaders of the House of Representatives agree by a majority vote on a recommendation for another date on which to reconvene. In the latter case, they shall jointly direct the executive director of the Legislative

Council to immediately poll all the members of the Legislature by telegram or telephone as to their agreement or disagreement with the recommended date. The director, within 72 hours of the receipt of the directive, shall certify to the presiding officers the result of the poll and, if a majority of the members to which each house is entitled respond in the affirmative the Legislature shall reconvene at 2:00 p.m. on the date announced and approved. If a majority of the members to which each house is entitled respond in the negative, the Legislature shall reconvene at the time and on the date set by this resolution.

### SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 24

**Relating to the adjournment sine die of the Second Regular Session of the Third Legislature.**

**Be it Resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives Concurring:**

That pursuant to Uniform Rule 51 the Second Regular Session of the Third

Legislature will stand adjourned sine die effective 1:00 a.m., Pacific Standard Time, May 30, 1964, unless the House of Representatives and Senate adopt motions for adjournment sine die at an earlier date or hour.
