

## CHAPTER 108

## AN ACT

**Appropriating national forest receipts; and providing for an effective date.**

(H.B. 282)

**Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

Section 1. The sum of \$56,900 is appropriated from national forest receipts in the general fund to the Department of Administration to be apportioned to eligible boroughs for the benefit of the public

schools and public roads of the boroughs according to the provisions of 16 USC Sec. 500 as amended.

Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

## CHAPTER 109

## AN ACT

**Relating to the acquisition, construction, and equipment of two student dormitories, a dining facility of a dormitory-dining complex, and a food service warehouse and preparation center for the University of Alaska and the issuance and sale of not to exceed \$4,590,000 of negotiable revenue bonds of the university to pay part or all of the cost thereof; providing that such revenue bonds and other revenue bonds of the university may be refunded; authorizing the issuance and sale of refunding bonds; and providing for an effective date.**

(S.B. 145)

**Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

Section 1. For the purpose of paying all or part of the cost of acquiring, constructing, and equipping two student dormitories, a dining facility of a dormitory-dining complex and a food service warehouse and preparation center for the University of Alaska, the issuance and sale of negotiable revenue bonds of the University of Alaska in the total principal sum of not to exceed \$4,590,000 is authorized. The principal of and interest on the bonds shall be paid out of and secured by the money required in sec. 3, ch. 56, SLA 1961, to be paid into the Housing System Revenue Fund and out of any other source which the legislature may authorize to be pledged to such payment.

Sec. 2. The bonds shall be issued and sold as provided in ch. 56, SLA 1961, as amended by ch. 47, SLA 1962. Such bonds and all heretofore and thereafter authorized negotiable revenue bonds of the university may be refunded as provided in sec. 9, ch. 56, SLA 1961, or any other laws which authorize that refunding of bonds of any municipal corporation or political subdivision of the state.

Sec. 3. The bonds authorized by this Act and the interest due upon them shall not constitute a general obligation of the State of Alaska or the University of Alaska.

Sec. 4. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

## CHAPTER 110

## AN ACT

**Appropriating for the operating and capital expenses of all departments, offices and agencies of state government; and providing for an effective date.**

(C.S.H.B. 44)

**Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

Section 1. The sum of \$86,124,000 is appropriated from the general fund and from special accounts in the general fund for the period beginning July 1, 1965, to be apportioned according to the schedules in secs. 5, 6 and 7 of this Act.

Sec. 9. If federal program receipts or other program receipts exceed the estimates appropriated by this Act, the appropriation from state funds for the affected program shall be reduced by the amount of excess, if the reductions are not inconsistent with applicable federal statutes and the excess of federal program receipts is appropriated to the affected program. However, if the program receipts, other than federal receipts, support programs that provide services for all state agencies, they may be made available by a budget amendment approved by the governor. The governor shall report the budget amendments by this section to the first session of the Fifth Legislature.

Sec. 10. If federal program receipts or other program receipts not appropriated by this Act and not requiring state matching money are received by a department, office or agency of the state during the fiscal period covered by this Act, they are appropriated and may be made available for expenditure by a budget amendment approved by the governor. The governor shall report the budget amendments allowed under this section to the first session of the Fifth Legislature.

Sec. 11. Adjustments may be made in the appropriations from a working capital fund for the fiscal period covered by this Act, when necessitated by changes in requirements for services and supplies. The adjustments shall be approved by the governor.

Sec. 12. Refunds may be made in the manner prescribed by law from the general fund in any amount due.

Sec. 13. This Act takes effect July 1, 1965.

## CHAPTER 111

### AN ACT

**Defining "outside" service for purposes of teacher retirement; and providing for an effective date.**

(C.S.H.B. 49)

**Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

Section 1. AS 14.25.220(8) is amended to read:

(8) "outside service" means service as a teacher in a public school or an institution of higher learning listed in the Annual Education Directory of Higher Education published by the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare not under the supervision and control of the Department of Education, the Territorial Board of Education, the State Board of Education sitting in any capa-

city, the school board of a borough school district, incorporated city school district, incorporated school district, independent school district, or the Board of Regents of the University of Alaska;

Sec. 2. This Act applies to a person employed as a fulltime teacher in membership service between July 1, 1964 and June 30, 1965, or a person employed as a full-time teacher in membership service any time subsequent to the effective date of this Act.

Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.

## CHAPTER 112

### AN ACT

**Relating to the pay plan for employees of the state; and providing for an effective date.**

(C.S.H.B. 119)

**Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

Section 1. AS 39.27.010 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

Sec. 39.27.010. **Monthly Salary Schedules.** The following monthly salary schedules are approved under AS 39.25.150(2) as the pay plan for employees of the state.
