

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 53

Relating to the construction of a small boat harbor at the City of Kenai.

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:

WHEREAS the people of the Kenai, Cook Inlet area derive a substantial portion of their livelihood from salmon fishing; and

WHEREAS the waters of Cook Inlet are constantly being used in pursuit of this livelihood; and

WHEREAS these waters are subject to violent storms and extreme tides during the fishing season, causing frequent loss of life and vessels; and

WHEREAS the United States Corps of Engineers has conducted a feasibility study of a small boat harbor for this area and has recommended its construction;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Congress of the United States is requested to appropriate to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers the funds necessary for the construction of a small boat harbor inside the mouth of the Kenai River adjacent to the City of Kenai, Alaska; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be sent to the Honorable Carl Hayden, Chairman of the Senate Appropriations Committee; the Honorable George H. Mahon, Chairman of the House Appropriations Committee; the Honorable Cyrus R. Vance, Secretary of the Department of the Army; Lt. Gen. Walter K. Wilson, Chief of Engineers, U.S. Army; Col. Clare D. Farley, District Engineer, Alaska; and the Honorable E. L. Bartlett and the Honorable Ernest Gruening, U.S. Senators, and the Honorable Ralph J. Rivers, U.S. Representative, members of the Alaska delegation in Congress.
