### SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 47

**Relating to the Bureau of Indian Affairs school at Unalakleet.**

**Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

WHEREAS the Bureau of Indian Affairs school at Unalakleet now provides schooling only through the tenth year; and

WHEREAS the William E. Beltz School in Nome concentrates on vocational education for students from northern and western Alaska in a program complementary to that of the Bureau of Indian Affairs Schools in the district; and

WHEREAS the William E. Beltz School at Nome is not adequate to serve all potential students of the area seeking something beyond an elementary school or junior high school education; and

WHEREAS an extension of the school program at the Unalakleet school through the twelfth year and the inclusion in its curriculum of useful industrial arts courses would help meet the demand, and broaden the opportunities, of students in the area now served and which could be served by that school; and

WHEREAS there is also no gymnasium at the Unalakleet school and the lack of such a facility prevents an adequate physical fitness program; and

WHEREAS the school at Unalakleet has inadequate housing for teachers and students, thereby making it exceedingly difficult to maintain a teaching staff and causing undue hardships and burdens on the student body;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Interior is urgently requested to make the Bureau of Indian Affairs school at Unalakleet a twelve-year school and to expand its curriculum to include useful industrial arts courses; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Interior is respectfully urged to construct a gymnasium and adequate housing facilities for teachers and students at the school in Unalakleet; and be it

### SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 48

**Requesting full appropriation support for the Commercial Fisheries Research and Development Act of 1964.**

**Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

WHEREAS the Congress in 1964 approved S. 627 which became the Commercial Fisheries Research and Development Act of 1964 (P.L. 88-309, 78 Stat. 197) which included a provision authorizing the appropriation each year of \$5,000,000

for apportionment to the states to carry out the purposes of that Act; and

WHEREAS it is the purpose of P.L. 88-309 to authorize the Secretary of the Interior to cooperate with the states in carrying out projects designed for the research and development of the commercial fisheries resources of the nation; and

WHEREAS the Legislature of the State of Alaska is now in session and considering the authority and budgeting for this

program on the state level since the Alaska fishery resource is the greatest in the nation and an accelerated effort in research and development is needed if we are to catch up and compete with foreign fishing enterprises; and

WHEREAS it is essential that Congress provide the full amount of funds authorized for this essential research and development of the national fishery through federal and state cooperation;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Congress is urged to appropriate the full amount of research and fishery funds authorized by the Commercial Fisheries Research and Development Act of 1964; and be it

#### SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 50

**Endorsing S. 1091, now before Congress, which relates to the exploration and development of the continental shelf.**

**Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

WHEREAS the members of the Alaska Legislature are familiar with Senator Bartlett's bill (S. 1091) which proposes a positive program for the exploration and economic development of the physical, chemical, geological and biological resources of the continental shelf; and

WHEREAS the Alaska Legislature is aware of the startling discoveries of rich and extensive mineral and other resources on the continental shelf which have been made in recent years; and

WHEREAS the Alaska Legislature believes that the potential economic value of the enormous resources awaiting exploration on the shelf is of such magni-

tude as to compel the adoption of the program made possible by S. 1091;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Alaska strongly endorses S. 1091 and urges the Congress of the United States now assembled to take appropriate action to insure its prompt passage; and be it

#### SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 52

**Relating to legislation to repeal Section 14(b) of the Labor Management Relations Act of 1947 Authorizing State Enactment of Right-to-Work Laws.**

**Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Alaska:**

WHEREAS Sec. 14(b) of the Labor Management Relations Act of 1947 permits States and Territories of the United States to prohibit contractual agreements between Labor and management requiring membership in a labor organization as a condition to continued employment; and
