## AN ACT

Relating to persons 19 or 20 years of age entering restaurants, which are also licensed to sell alcoholic beverages, for purpose of dining."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

\* Section 1. AS 04.15.020(d) is amended to read:

(d) Presence of minors on premises. It is unlawful to permit a person under the age of 21 years to enter licensed premises unless the minor is accompanied by his parent, guardian or spouse who has attained the age of 21 years. However, a person who is 19 or 20 years of age may enter licensed premises which are also recognized as a restaurant for the purpose of dining. A person under the age of 19 years may enter licensed premises which are also recognized as a restaurant for the purpose of dining if accompanied by the parent or guardian of any other minor also present, or with any other adult with the consent or acquiescence of the minor's parent or guardian. The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, with the approval of the city council if the premises are within the city or with the approval of the borough assembly if the premises are outside the city

but within a borough, shall designate which premises are restaurants for the purposes of this section. The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board shall promulgate regulations for the designation of restaurants and the continuation or withdrawal of the designation. No establishment may be designated as a restaurant for purposes of dining without the consent of the licensee.
