## AN ACT

Relating to the revision of the Alaska Administrative Code; and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

\* Section 1. AS 44.62.130(b) is repealed and re-enacted to read:

(b) The legislative council shall prescribe a uniform system of indexing, numbering, arrangement of text and citation of authority and history notes for the Alaska Administrative Code.

\* Sec. 2. (a) The legislative council shall revise the regulations contained in the Alaska Administrative Code into a more concise, meaningful and uniform body of law. When the legislative council has completed the revision of regulations relating to a given subject and the agency responsible for promulgating them has approved the substantive meaning of each revised regulation, the promulgating agency shall proceed to adopt the revision under AS 44.62.180 - 44.62.290. As an aid to the promulgation of future regulations, the legislative council staff shall devise a manual instructing the various departments and agencies of the state on

the drafting and preparation of regulations for filing and publication.

(b) As soon as is feasible, the legislative council shall report to the legislature on costs and alternate methods of printing and indexing the revised code in a more readable and easily maintained form, giving special emphasis to the possibility of printing the code in the form used in the Alaska Rules of Court Procedure and Administration. At that time the legislative council shall also submit to the legislature the method it recommends for the future promulgation, publication and distribution of administrative regulations.

\* Sec. 3. AS 44.62.050 is amended to read:

Sec. 44.62.050. STYLE AND FORM OF FILING. The secretary of state shall prescribe a standard size form to be used in filing regulations under sec. 40 of this chapter.

\* Sec. 4. AS 44.62.060(d) is amended to read:

(d) The secretary of state shall not file a regulation, amendment, or order of repeal until he receives both a copy of the regulation, amendment, or order of repeal required by sec. 40 of this chapter and an opinion of the Department of Law indicating that the regulation, amendment, or order of repeal is authorized by statute. The secretary of state shall examine each regulation, amendment, or order of repeal transmitted to him for filing and determine whether or not it complies with the requirements prescribed by the legislative council under sec. 130(b) of this chapter. This section shall not pertain to emergency regulations.

\* Sec. 5. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
