AN ACT

Relating to the classification of lands for homestead entry; and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 38.05.325 is amended to read:

Sec. 38.05.325. HOMESTEAD ENTRY. The director, with the approval of the commissioner, may authorize homestead entry on lands not under grazing lease or otherwise appropriated and which are classified as agricultural lands or grazing lands, if they are not school lands, mental health lands or lands conveyed to the state by the federal government for the specific purpose of producing revenue.

* Sec. 2. AS 38.05.365(2) is amended to read:

(2) "agricultural lands" means lands chiefly valuable for agricultural purposes;

* Sec. 3. AS 38.05.365 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

(21) "grazing lands" means lands chiefly valuable for grazing purposes.

* Sec. 4. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage

and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
