JOINT RESOLUTION

Requesting the construction of a seawall at Kake, Alaska.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the community of Kake, Alaska, is an important fishing and logging center; and

WHEREAS the resident fishing fleet at Kake is presently without any protection from the heavy winter storms; and

WHEREAS the expanding logging operations in this area make the need for a protected anchorage more pressing; and

WHEREAS the fishing fleet has sustained storm damage in excess of \$50,000 over the past three years, mainly because of the lack of any protection from these storms;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Corps of Engineers, U. S. Army, is requested to give consideration to the construction of a seawall at Kake, Alaska.

COPIES of this resolution shall be sent to Maj. Gen. William F. Cassidy, Chief of Engineers, U. S. Army; Col. Clare D. Farley, District Engineer, Corps of Engineers, Alaska; and the Honorable E. L. Bartlett and the Honorable Ernest Gruening, U. S. Senators,

of the Alaska delegation in Congress.
