JOINT RESOLUTION

Requesting a second-class post office for Nightmute, Alaska.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the village of Nightmute has a population of approximately 150 people; and

WHEREAS the people of Nightmute are without mail service although the airplanes carrying mail pass over the village on their way to other stops; and

WHEREAS the village must now pick up its mail by making an overland trip of about 25 miles although the mail plane which now passes over the village could land on floats or skis; and

WHEREAS the village of Nightmute needs a second-class post office in order to be eligible for and receive mail service;

BE IT RESOLVED that the U. S. Post Office Department is requested to provide the village of Nightmute, Alaska, with a second-class post office facility.
