JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to the proposed Captain Cook State Park.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the State of Alaska has selected lands, subject to federal approval, for the creation of a state park; and

WHEREAS the selection anticipates the establishment of Captain Cook State Park at Point Possession as an historical park; and

WHEREAS with the rapid development in the area of the planned park it is essential that the land selection be approved at an early date so that the park area can be set aside and the necessary planning initiated;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of the State of Alaska urges the Department of the Interior to proceed with all possible speed to approve the selection of the State of Alaska of approximately 5,120 acres of land at Point Possession in order that the state can proceed with plans for designation of the site as the Captain Cook State Park.
