JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to a State Conference on Alcoholism.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the problem of alcoholism is recognized as being a serious social problem; and

WHEREAS the National Institute of Mental Health, upon receiving an acceptable plan, has offered to finance an Alaska State Conference on alcoholism; and

WHEREAS the State Department of Health and Welfare has accepted responsibility to develop a Conference Planning Committee; and

WHEREAS the Planning Committee is to include, but not be limited to, representation from the State Judiciary, Law Enforcement, Alcoholics Anonymous, Social Agencies, Labor Organizations, Church Groups, the Liquor Industry, Chambers of Commerce, Women's Clubs, Service Clubs, as well as Community Action Groups; and

WHEREAS the Conference will have the general broad functions of educating the public as to the problem of alcoholism and the

development of recommendations for a formalized State program to answer the problem of alcoholism;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature supports the planning, implementation and holding of such a conference and will take into consideration any recommendations developed from the conference; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor of Alaska appoint the members of the Planning Committee.
