JOINT RESOLUTION

Urging the continuation of the Federal Aid to Airports Program.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the Federal Aid to Airports Program will expire on June 30, 1966 unless extended; and

WHEREAS the Federal Aid to Airports Program is vital to the nation but particularly vital to Alaska which is so dependent on air transportation for its existence and growth; and

WHEREAS a decision on another three-year extension of the program is now before Congress;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislature of the State of Alaska that Congress is urged to continue the Federal Aid to Airports Program because it is essential to the national interest and of vital necessity to the State of Alaska.
