## AN ACT

Authorizing organized boroughs to prohibit political signs along public thoroughfares for certain periods of time.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

\* Section 1. AS 07.15.340(a) is amended to read:

(a) The first and second class borough has the responsibility of planning, platting, and zoning on an area-wide basis and shall do so in the manner provided for first class cities, except as otherwise provided in this section. The planning commission shall also be the zoning commission. Nothing in this section prevents any city from having a planning and zoning commission in an advisory capacity. Appointment of borough planning and zoning commission members from a first class city shall be made from the city advisory commission membership.

\* Sec. 2. AS 07.15.340 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

(c) The assembly may by ordinance prohibit the erection of political signs along public roads and highways, except that, subject to reasonable regulation, political signs which do not exceed four by eight feet shall be permitted for the period commencing 30 days before the state primary election and ending 15 days after the state general election and for a period commencing 30 days before and ending 15 days after a borough or city election (including all run-off elections).
