AN ACT

Restricting certain state-owned lands and waters to use as a public recreation area.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. **PURPOSE.** The purpose of this Act is to restrict all vacant and unappropriated state-owned lands, waters, and stream crossings within the boundaries described in this Act to use as a public recreation area. Under the provisions of AS 38.05.300, state land, water, or land and water containing more than 640 acres may be closed to multiple purpose use only by Act of the legislature. Inasmuch as the area described in this Act exceeds 640 acres, this Act is intended to except the area described from the provisions of AS 38.05.300.

* Sec. 2. **DESIGNATED STATE LANDS AND WATERS RESTRICTED TO USE AS PUBLIC RECREATION AREA.** The presently state-owned lands and waters, vacant and unappropriated, and all those acquired in the future by the state, lying within the following described boundary, are hereby designated as the Chena River Recreation Area, are reserved from all uses incompatible with their primary function as public recreation lands, and are assigned to the Department of Natural Resources for control, development and maintenance:

Protracted Sections and Townships

Township 1 North, Range 6 East, Fairbanks Meridian, Section 24; Township 1 North, Range 7 East, Fairbanks Meridian, Section 1, 2, 3, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 15, 16, 17, 19, 20, and 21; Township 2 North, Range 7 East, Fairbanks Meridian, Sections 12, 13, 24, 25, 35, and 36; Township 2 North, Range 8 East, Fairbanks Meridian, Sections 6, 7, and 18.

* Sec. 3. INCOMPATIBLE USES PROHIBITED. The commissioner of natural resources shall designate by regulation incompatible uses within the boundaries of the Chena River Recreation Area in accordance with the requirements of sec. 1 of this Act, and those incompatible uses designated shall be prohibited or restricted, as provided by regulation.
