## AN ACT

Relating to qualifications of the members of the assembly of an organized borough.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

\* Section 1. AS 07.20.050 is amended to read:

Sec. 07.20.050. QUALIFICATIONS. A person is eligible to be a member of the assembly if he is a qualified voter of the borough. Additional residency requirements not to exceed three years may be prescribed by ordinance for members of the assembly elected from the area outside first class cities. If a member of the assembly ceases to be a qualified voter of the borough, he shall immediately forfeit his office. If a member elected from the area outside first class cities becomes a resident of a first class city or becomes a resident of a borough election section in the area outside first class cities other than the section from which he was elected, he shall immediately forfeit his office, except that the assembly may by general ordinance provide otherwise, but in no event may a member serve beyond the next general election.

\* Sec. 2. AS 07.25.010 is amended to read:

Sec. 07.25.010. EXECUTIVE POWER. The executive power of the organized borough is vested in the borough chairman who is elected at large. He must be a qualified voter of the area encompassed by the boundaries of the organized borough. Additional residency requirements not to exceed three years may be prescribed by ordinance for the borough chairman. His term of office is the same as that of the mayor in the largest first class city in the borough or three years if there is no first class city in the borough. The term of office begins on the same day as that of the mayor in the largest first class city in the borough or on

the first Monday following his election if there is no first class city in the borough. The assembly may provide a different term by ordinance.
