AN ACT

Relating to the penalty for driving a vehicle without the owner's consent.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 28.35.010(a) is amended to read:

(a) A person who drives, tows away, or takes a vehicle not his own without the consent of the owner, with intent temporarily to deprive the owner of possession of the vehicle, or a person who is a party or accessory to or an accomplice in the driving or unauthorized taking is guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction is punishable by imprisonment for not more than one year, or by a fine of not more than \$1,000, or by both. Upon a conviction for a second or subsequent offense, the offender may be charged with a felony, and if so charged and convicted, is punishable by imprisonment for not more than three years, or by a fine of not more than \$5,000. The court may, upon conviction of a second or subsequent violation of this section, suspend the offender's license to drive a motor vehicle for a period of not to exceed three years. The consent of the owner of a vehicle to its driving, towing away, or taking shall not be presumed or implied because of the owner's consent on previous occasions to the driving, towing away or taking of the vehicle by the same or a different person.
