AN ACT

Relating to the taking of game by proxy for the blind; and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 16.05 is amended by adding a new section to read:

Sec. 16.05.405. TAKING OF GAME BY PROXY FOR THE BLIND. (a) A resident holding a valid hunting license may take moose, caribou, deer, or elk under a hunting license issued to a blind resident in accordance with (b) of this section if the resident has the license of the blind person in his actual possession.

(b) A resident hunting license indicating that the purchaser is blind may be obtained from the Department of Revenue upon payment of the fee prescribed in sec. 340 of this chapter and upon presentation of either an affidavit of the applicant stating that he cannot distinguish light from darkness or an affidavit signed by a licensed physician or a licensed optometrist stating that the applicant's central visual acuity does not exceed 20/200 in the better eye with correcting lenses or that his widest diameter of visual field subtends an angle no greater than 20 degrees.

* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without approval.
