SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 15

Directing the Legislative Council to proceed with the revision of the Administrative Code as set out in the Legislative Council study of December 1966.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the Alaska Administrative Code is a growing body of administrative law containing the regulations of executive agencies which implement the laws passed by the Legislature; and

WHEREAS there has been increasing concern regarding the content, form and availability for use of the Alaska Administrative Code as a vital body of law; and

WHEREAS this increasing concern led to the Legislature directing the Legislative Council to revise the regulations contained in the Alaska Administrative Code into a more concise, meaningful and uniform body of law; and

WHEREAS the Legislative Council completed, in December of 1966, a review of the effectiveness and suitability of the Alaska Administrative Code;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Council is directed to proceed with the revision of the Alaska Administrative Code as set out in the Legislative Council study of December 1966 "The Alaska Administrative Code."
