SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 33

Relating to a pilot program for teaching Alaska's youth the value of basic cleanliness and respect for its own and other people's property.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the youth of Alaska is our greatest natural resource;
and

WHEREAS the needless scourge of litter, defacing of buildings, vandalizing and the disrespect for each other's property does exist in our state discouraging Alaska's economic development and tourism and marring Alaska's great scenic beauty; and

WHEREAS great potential exists in Alaska's youth which has boundless energy and enthusiasm for whatever it does;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Governor is respectfully requested to urge the Alaska Centennial Cleanup Program "Operation Big Sweep" to work with all pertinent state and federal agencies for setting up a pilot program in Alaska for teaching children and young adults the value of basic cleanliness in a community and respect for their own property as well as for property of others; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that all aspects of this program be reported back to the Legislature in January, 1968.
