JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to the location of fish protein concentrate manufacturing plants in South Central Alaska.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the Commissioner of the Food and Drug Administration has approved the use of whole fish protein concentrate as a food additive; and

WHEREAS Congress has recently passed legislation authorizing the construction of one fish protein concentrate manufacturing plant and the leasing of a second, locations to be determined by the Secretary of the Interior; and

WHEREAS Alaska is one of the greatest fishing areas of the world and as such is an ideal location for the operation of fish protein concentration plants; and

WHEREAS production of fish protein concentrate in Alaska would greatly benefit the economy of the state;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Interior is respectfully requested to locate the fish protein concentrate manufacturing plants authorized recently by Congress in South Central Alaska.

COPIES of this Resolution shall be sent to the Honorable Lyndon B. Johnson, President of the United States; the Honorable Stewart L. Udall, Secretary of the Interior; and to the Honorable E.L. Bartlett and the Honorable Ernest Gruening, U.S. Senators, and the Honorable Howard W. Pollock, U.S. Representative, members of the Alaska delegation in Congress.
