AN ACT

Providing that drivers' licenses be sufficient for proof of age as regards the liquor laws.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 04.15 is amended by adding a new section to read:

Sec. 04.15.065. DRIVER'S LICENSE AS PROOF OF AGE.
A valid Alaska driver's license shall be acceptable as proof of age when used for identification in the purchase of liquor and for presence in establishments where liquor is sold if the license is made of or encased in plastic and contains a photograph of the license holder and a statement of his age or date of birth. The liquor licensee shall not be held liable for any of the penalties imposed for serving minors or permitting minors on the premises when such a driver's license indicates that the owner and possessor of the license is 21 years of age or over.
