HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 1

Relating to the appointment of a representative from Alaska to the Presidential Prayer Breakfast.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the legislature recognizes that the strength of an individual community, state or nation is relative to and dependent upon spiritual values; and

WHEREAS the founding and history of our nation was based on and interwoven with man's faith that God has a hand in the affairs of men; and

WHEREAS the legislature recognizes that spiritual values and faith in divine guidance should have increasing emphasis in our time; and

WHEREAS it is good that leaders of our nation and the world meet in spiritual attitude and prayer; therefore in recognition of the tradition of our forefathers

BE IT RESOLVED that the Governor is respectfully requested to appoint Representative Jack R. Simpson to represent the Governor, the legislature, and the State of Alaska at the prayer breakfast with President Lyndon B. Johnson to be held in Washington, D.C. on February 1, 1968.
