JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to the establishment of a post office at Coffman Cove, Alaska.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS communication facilities are essential for the development of Alaska and the normal comforts of its population; and

WHEREAS the town of Coffman Cove, Alaska, has a population of over 200 people and is without a post office; and

WHEREAS Coffman Cove has great need of a post office because of the requirements of its growing population and because of the location in the area of a fish buying station, a state school, and three logging camps; and

WHEREAS there are a number of willing individuals in the town who are capable of performing the functions of a postmaster;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Postmaster General of the United States is respectfully requested to establish a post office at the town of Coffman Cove, Alaska.

COPIES of this Resolution shall be sent to The Honorable Lyndon B. Johnson, President of the United States; The Honorable Lawrence F. O'Brien, Postmaster General; and to The Honorable E.L. Bartlett and The Honorable Ernest Gruening, U.S. Senators, and The Honorable Howard W. Pollock, U.S. Representative, members of the Alaska delegation in Congress.
