HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 12

Expressing the grief of the Alaska House of Representatives over the death of Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

WHEREAS Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr. was a man with a dream, a dream which included all men of all races; and

WHEREAS the history of the Civil Rights movement in this nation is inextricably bound together with the history of Reverend King, the man and the dream;

WHEREAS this dream will never be fully realized by him because of a senseless and deplorable act of violence; and

WHEREAS, as recipient of the 1964 Nobel Peace Prize, his name and deeds were known throughout the world; and

WHEREAS Reverend King led a life which was a model of Christian love and charity and one which if emulated by others would result in a better world for all; and

WHEREAS Reverend King was a devoted husband and a kind and gentle father to his children;

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Fifth State Legislature of the State of Alaska that this Resolution serve as an expression of grief at the passing of Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr. and as a token of sympathy to his wife, Coretta, and their children.
