SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 30

Relating to regulations dealing with brown and grizzly bear.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the decline in the number of brown and grizzly bear in certain game management units has given rise to the possibility of severe season curtailments; and

WHEREAS announcements by the Board of Fish and Game of these season changes or curtailments if made less than six months in advance of the normal season pose great difficulties to those persons desiring to hunt brown and grizzly bear; and

WHEREAS unlike other species of game, winter mortality studies play no part in determining seasons for bear and thus the necessity for computing these statistics is eliminated;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Fish and Game is respectfully requested to promulgate regulations dealing with brown and grizzly bear seasons at least six months prior to the date they are to go into effect.
