SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 38

Relating to the late Andrew Hope.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS God, by His healing hand, has taken away the pain of suffering by calling to Himself our beloved friend and former colleague, Andrew Hope; and

WHEREAS Andrew Hope served as a Representative in this Legislature for 14 years -- 10 during territorial status, and the first four years of Alaska's statehood; and

WHEREAS Andrew Hope was a Tlingit, of the Eagle tribe, and the Kag Wan Toon Clan, a proud man and highly esteemed, he was first and foremost a citizen of this great state, concerned with all its people; and

WHEREAS Andrew Hope was among the early organizers of the Alaska Native Brotherhood and the Alaska Native Sisterhood, and served several terms as President of the Grand Camp of the Alaska Native Brotherhood; and

WHEREAS Andrew Hope will be remembered for his exceptional leadership and direction of his people, his dedicated service in the Legislature, and enthusiastic participation in civic activities; and

WHEREAS his many friends are saddened by news of his passing;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature by this Resolution acknowledges its loss of a close friend, respected colleague, and

outstanding citizen, and extends to his sorrowing family its deepest sympathy in their loss of a devoted husband and father.
