SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 48

Relating to the solution of problems between school boards and teachers.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the Constitution of the State of Alaska charges the Legislature with the responsibility of establishing and maintaining a system of public schools; and

WHEREAS the disagreements and conflicts between teachers and their school boards have reached serious proportions in several areas of the state, causing the Legislature to become particularly concerned in this area; and

WHEREAS the Legislature believes that the settlement of these disagreements lies initially in the hands of both the elected members of local school boards and of the teachers themselves;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature expresses its desire that disagreements between school boards and teachers be resolved, if possible, on the local level rather than by state law, and urges the school boards and teachers in the state to establish, prior to the second session of the Sixth State Legislature, their own procedures and methods of negotiations in order to deal with all matters pertaining to teacher employment and the fulfillment of the duties of teachers and board members.

COPIES of this Resolution shall be sent to the Honorable Keith H. Miller, Governor of Alaska; the Honorable Clifford R. Hartman, Commissioner of the Department of Education; and to the Association of School Superintendents, the state Board of Education, and each school board and each local education association in the state.
