AN ACT

Relating to the warehousing of intoxicating beverages; and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 04.15 is amended by adding a new section to read:

Sec. 04.15.035. WAREHOUSING OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR.

(a) A licensee may not stock, warehouse, or otherwise store alcoholic liquor in a place other than the premises indicated on his license unless

(1) the premises to be used for storage are inspected and approved by the board before their use;

(2) the use of the premises for storage is authorized by applicable zoning ordinances; and

(3) the premises are accessible for inspection as provided in sec. 20(f) of this chapter.

(b) No liquor sales or other liquor business may be transacted from premises approved for storage under this section.

(c) Intoxicating liquor that is warehoused or otherwise stored on premises that are not licensed or have not been approved under this section is contraband and subject to confiscation by the state and any intoxicating liquor seized shall be sold as provided in sec. 50 of this chapter.

* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without approval.
