## AN ACT

Amending the residence requirement for admission to the bar; and providing for an effective date.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

\* Section 1. AS 08.08.130 is amended to read:

Sec. 08.08.130. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION. (a) A person who does not qualify under sec. 140 of this chapter is eligible for admission to the Alaska Bar if he

(1) is a citizen of the United States;

(2) is over 21 years of age;

(3) has been a bona fide resident of the state for at least 30 days immediately before the date of his examination and continuing to and including the date of his admission;

(4) is a graduate of a law school approved by the American Bar Association, or an attorney in good standing in the bar of another state or territory, or has begun a clerkship before January 1, 1967, and completed it in the manner required by sec. 35-2-44 ACLA 1949;

(5) has passed a bar examination given by the Alaska Bar.

(b) The date for the examination shall be at least 75 days after the application for admission is made.

\* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without approval.
