AN ACT

Relating to liquor identification cards.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 04.15 is amended by adding a new section to read:

Sec. 04.15.063. LIQUOR IDENTIFICATION CARD. Upon reaching the age of 19, a person may apply to the department for a nontransferable liquor identification card. In addition to the requirements of sec. 65 of this chapter, the department shall provide by regulation for the issuance of the card specified in this section, including but not limited to a fee for issuance, the format of the card, and the procedure for issuance.

* Sec. 2. AS 04.15.065 is amended to read:

Sec. 04.15.065. DRIVER'S LICENSE AS PROOF OF AGE. A valid Alaska driver's license or a liquor identification card issued under sec. 63 of this chapter is acceptable as proof of age when used for identification in the purchase of liquor and for presence in establishments where liquor is sold if the license or identification card is made of or encased in plastic and contains a photograph of the license holder and a statement of his age or date of birth. The liquor licensee may not be held liable for any of the penalties imposed for serving minors or permitting minors on the premises when such a driver's license or identification card indicates that the owner and possessor of the license is 19 years of age or over.
