HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 55

Honoring Dave Adler.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS pioneer Alaskan Dave Adler of Fairbanks has recently passed away; and

WHEREAS in 1928 Dave Adler began the first book store in Alaska which, through the years, gained a national reputation for its collection of books on Alaska; and

WHEREAS he was also active in civic and fraternal activities throughout his many years in Fairbanks, having been an active participant in organizing the Eskimo Olympics, and serving as King Regent in the 1967 Golden Days, as adjutant for American Legion Post No. 11 for 25 years, and as secretary of the Elks Lodge for 20 years; and

WHEREAS Dave Adler truly typified the pioneer Alaskan and his contributions to his community and to his fellowmen will not be forgotten;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska Legislature that it expresses its grief at the passing of Dave Adler but makes known its conviction that Fairbanks and Alaska will long remember him as a man who did more than his share in all of his human endeavors.
