SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 23

Honoring Phillip M. Holland.

BE IT RESOLVED

BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS Phillip M. Holland, one of Alaska's outstanding young citizens, has met an untimely death; and

WHEREAS, although at the time of his death he was only 25 years of age, he had already contributed greatly to the development of his community and fellow citizens both of the state and the nation; and

WHEREAS his accomplishments included service as president of the student body at the University of Alaska, establishment of the first university-sponsored free tutorial program for children in the North Star Borough, service as a member of the United States President's Special Study Group on Student Stress during 1967-68, and many other activities of a civic nature, all toward the goal of aiding his community and fellowman; and

WHEREAS at the time of his death he was in service to his country as an agricultural specialist in the Peace Corps assigned to rural India;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Seventh Alaska State Legislature extends its most sincere condolences to the family of Phillip M. Holland and that this Resolution serve as an expression of high regard and esteem for the dedication and faithful service to his fellowmen which Phillip M. Holland practiced, without fail, for the totality of his life.
