SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 24

Commending Bruce Kendall.

BE IT RESOLVED

BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS Mr. Bruce Kendall, former Speaker of the Alaska House of Representatives, a business leader in the Anchorage community, has encouraged the involvement of youth in democracy by transporting 16 Alaska high school students to the state capital from their homes in or near Anchorage, for the purpose of observing government in action; and

WHEREAS by such an investment in Alaska's youth and our way of life, Mr. Kendall is promoting interest and understanding of our system of government; and

WHEREAS it is the policy of the State of Alaska, as emphasized by Governor Egan in his 1971 "State of the State" message, and by other leaders, to encourage youth involvement and participation; and

WHEREAS the high school students selected for the trip to Juneau were chosen by faculty members at their respective high schools on an impartial basis, thus further stimulating and motivating youth interest in state governmental affairs;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature commends Bruce Kendall for this outstanding civic contribution and encourages other business leaders to follow this example with a view to spreading broader understanding of state government among resident Alaska youths.
