## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4

Honoring Louis J. Glatz.

**BE IT RESOLVED**

**BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

WHEREAS Louis J. Glatz, one of Alaska's premier citizens, passed away suddenly on December 22, 1970; and

WHEREAS, since his arrival in Alaska in 1922, Mr. Glatz continuously and unselfishly served the State of Alaska and its people in many capacities; and

WHEREAS his many activities and posts included supervision of the installation of most of the aids to navigation in South-eastern Alaska, service as Commanding Officer of the cutters Cedar, Sweetbriar and Hemlock, service as the Mayor of the Gateway City, service as a charter member and former president of the Tongass Historical Society, active participation in the Masons and Pioneers of Alaska; and

WHEREAS Commander Glatz was known from the Bering Sea to Puget Sound and was noted for his humorous accounts of his experiences and his witty comments and observations concerning many facets of life;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature expresses its sincere sorrow at the loss to Alaska of Louis J. Glatz and conveys the most heartfelt condolences to his wife Connie, and other members of his family.
