AN ACT

Relating to the qualifications of notaries public.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 44.50.020 is amended to read:

Sec. 44.50.020. QUALIFICATIONS. A person appointed a notary public shall be, at the time of submitting his application, a citizen of the United States and a resident at least 19 years of age. In this section, "resident" means a person who maintains his permanent place of abode in Alaska, and is in fact living here.

* Sec. 2. AS 44.50.130 is amended to read:

Sec. 44.50.130. FILING OATH AND BOND. (a) An application for a notary public commission shall include a statement under oath that the applicant is a citizen of the United States and a resident of Alaska, as defined in sec. 20 of this chapter.

(b) A person appointed a notary public shall file his bond and the oath set out in AS 39.05.130 with the lieutenant governor. The oath must be notarized and signed by the appointee.
