HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 13

Honoring Albert White.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS Albert White, a long-time Juneau resident and former resident of Valdez, has passed away; and

WHEREAS he was known throughout Alaska through his many activities, and was affectionately known as "Mr. Republican" by his colleagues and friends; and

WHEREAS during his many years in Alaska he served as United States Marshall of the first Territorial Division for eight years, was a member of the Alaska Territorial Bar Association, active in the local business community of Juneau as owner and operator of the Bon Marche and as a real estate broker and developer; and
