HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 66

Honoring A. H. Ziegler.

BE IT RESOLVED

BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS Alaska has lost through death one of its most widely known and revered citizens, A. H. Ziegler; and

WHEREAS A. H. Ziegler was known and respected throughout the state as a man dedicated to his chosen profession of the law, his community and the state; and

WHEREAS he served with distinction in the Ninth, Tenth, and Twelfth Territorial Legislatures in the House of Representatives and also served as Mayor of Ketchikan with equal zeal; and

WHEREAS during his career he also was a member of the Board of Education for over 25 years, during which time his expertise and dedication were oriented toward the development of our Alaskan youth; and

WHEREAS he will be long-remembered as a man who gave of himself selflessly to better not only his home community of Ketchikan, but the welfare of all Alaskans everywhere;
