HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 3

Honoring Robert W. Korn.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

WHEREAS death has taken one of Alaska's most distinguished and respected citizens, Robert W. Korn; and

WHEREAS "Bob" Korn, since his arrival in Cordova in 1920, was active in bettering his chosen community and the State of Alaska; and

WHEREAS during his life in Alaska he served as Mayor of Cordova, as a member of the Local Boundary Commission, and as a member of innumerable local boards and commissions, giving of his time and knowledge, as needed; and

WHEREAS in his later years he was dedicated to the work of the Pioneers of Alaska, of which he was a recent Past State President; and

WHEREAS, in addition to his involvement in these various activities on the local and state level, he will be principally remembered for his many unnoted and unsung charities; and

WHEREAS "Bob" himself believed that support of and involvement in activities directed toward the education and academic and social development of the young was of the highest import;

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives that this Resolution serve as a token of the esteem and affection in which all who have known "Bob" Korn held him, and as an expression of its sorrow at the passing of Robert W. Korn.
