## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 25

Relating to a study of mandatory contributions by state employees under the Federal Insurance Contributions Act.

### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS currently all employees of the State of Alaska are required to contribute to social security; and

WHEREAS many state employees have expressed a desire that mandatory extension of the Federal Old Age and Survivors Insurance System be eliminated; and

WHEREAS many jurisdictions give their state employees the option of paying into social security or not; and

WHEREAS many employees will never receive any of the benefits of the Federal Old Age and Survivors Insurance Program and contribute to other varied retirement programs;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska Legislature that the Department of Administration study and report on the economic and social impact to state employees if mandatory social security payments were eliminated, and the contributions made to the Public Employees Retirement System or an alternate plan; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Administration's report, with its recommendations, be given to the First Session of the Eighth Legislature.
